WHAT IS FDA CERTIFICATION?

- **FDA Certification** refers to the approval or clearance issued by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for products regulated under its jurisdiction, such as food, drugs, cosmetics, and medical devices.



PURPOSE OF FDA CERTIFICATION

- **Key objectives include:**
- **Ensure safety and efficacy of products**
- **Protect public health**
- **Ensure regulatory compliance for market access**



PRODUCTS REGULATED BY FDA

- **FDA oversees the safety of the following:**
- **Food and beverages**
- **Pharmaceuticals**
- **Medical devices**
- **Cosmetics**
- **Tobacco products**

FDA APPROVAL PROCESS

The certification process generally includes:

- 1. Pre-market Approval**
- 2. Facility Inspection**
- 3. Product Testing and Evaluation**
- 4. Documentation Review**
- 5. Post-market Surveillance**



REGISTRATION VS. CERTIFICATION



- **Understanding the difference:**
- **FDA Registration:** Facility listed with FDA (not an endorsement)
- **FDA Certification:** Product meets FDA standards through testing/approval

- **Consumer trust and product credibility**
- **Higher global acceptance**
- **Better risk management and safety assurance**
